Thoughts

John 6:28-29 (NIV): "To believe in the One he has sent!"

Sometimes we meet people of whom we may be more than a little suspicious about or wary about. We do need to protect ourselves and to keep others safe too, but at the same time we shouldn't regard them as people to avoid or, on the other hand, as "targets" for us to save.

We, like them, are all God's children who are less than perfect and need God's love.

We need to ask God to help us to see each other as He does. That is, in need of His love, grace and forgiveness.

God provides this to us through His only Son, Jesus, whose obedience to His Father, and whose love for us, His courage, sacrifice and faith, leads to our being redeemed when we believe who Jesus is.

Our lives must show this belief. No matter what good deeds we do, and have a duty to do, for others in physical and spiritual need, before we can really share the good news with others, we ourselves have to totally believe who Jesus is.

John 3 v16

- ¹⁶ For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son, that everyone who believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life.
- ¹⁷ For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through Him.
- ¹⁸ Whoever believes in Him is not condemned, but whoever does not believe has already been condemned, because he has not believed in the name of God's one and only Son.
