Candlemas

Candlemas - the Feast of the Presentation – is celebrated on February 2nd each year.

It marks the moment when Mary and Joseph presented Jesus to the Temple as an infant – 40 days old– the traditional Jewish practice in those times - and made an offering to thank God for the birth of their son.

As they entered the Temple, an old man named Simeon saw them, declaring that the infant Jesus would become the light of the world. (Luke 22 v40)

It's a moment of hope and joy, and it's worth celebrating.

This is the day on which many Christian traditions bring out all their new candles for the coming year and bless them.

This, is why the Presentation is also celebrated as "Candlemas."

Candlemas is a time of year when the lengthening of daylight hours becomes noticeable.

The day is celebrated at a time when winter will soon be over, and spring will come. The time of darkness and bare earth is shortening.

In our gardens, Snowdrop (Galanthus), also known as Candlemas Bell, because they often bloom right around the time of Candlemas, are again appearing.

The candles, of course, represent the coming of Jesus as the Light into a world of spiritual darkness and we progresses towards the brightness of the Easter Resurrection of Jesus.

Those candles denote the fact that Jesus, light of the world is here, that whatever shadows have darkened our days, they are going to pass.

It's a time of hope and joy, and it's worth celebrating.



It marks the midway point between the winter solstice and spring equinox.

For those of us living in the wintry northern hemisphere, making it halfway through winter is itself, a cause for celebration!

Simeon recognises the infant Jesus as the Messiah, the one who will be a light, not just to Israel, but to the Gentiles, to everyone.

May we bring something of Christ's light to those we encounter today.
