- Don't forget that each Tuesday afternoon at 1.00pm - 2.00pm +/- you are invited to our Bible Study sessions which recently restarted. Now that summer is here, it is hoped that the meetings can be outside in the church garden. If the weather is inclement, then we will retreat back into the building. Masks will be required to be worn in that case. At present, the meetings are being led by our own Rev Tony, who is covering for John G, who is on holiday. You are welcome to attend no matter where you normally share fellowship.

**Nehemiah 8 v18 (NIV)**

*“This day is holy to our Lord. Do not grieve, for the joy of the LORD is your strength.”*

At the present many things are unjust, unrewarded, worrying, and hard work, and the last thing that you feel like doing, may be to praise God!

But these are the very times when we need to praise God.

Anytime that you praise God, especially when it is the last thing that you feel like doing, heaven’s forces will work for you!

As at the Battle of Jericho, you need to shout praises to God when you are up against a brick wall; or when it feels that you are going round in circles; or your circumstances seem to mock you; or when the plan does not seem to make sense; or when it is the last thing you feel like doing.

But when you praise God despite everything being fraught and everything seems like waste of time, then, *“Do not grieve for the joy of the Lord is your strength!”* (Nehemiah 8 v18).

When you are ruled by circumstances and emotions, you live life on a falling lift.

But when you look to God, Lord of your circumstances, and you praise Him, you move from weakness to strength!

It is 200 years since he served as minister at the Baptist Church and we are celebrating his life and work.

He served as a Baptist Minister for 50 years,

and he started the first school in Hamsterley village.

and he lived in the Manse next door.

Also, he was the founder of several other new
