Don't Doubt God's Word

Romans 10:17 NIV: Faith comes from hearing.

You may doubt your own ability, but never doubt God's - or His promises and His willingness to fulfil them.

The psalmist wrote, 'You have magnified Your word above... Your name' (Psalm 138:2 NKJV).

The only thing in the universe that God has placed above His name is His Word, so fill your mind with it, speak it daily, and don't ever question it.

Doubt often comes from our inclination/wish to appear as self-confident.

Self-confidence is a concept touted by the world; it encourages us to rely on our own skills and abilities.

But the Bible says, 'Those who trust in themselves are fools' (Proverbs 28:26 NIV).

The verse considered to be at the centre of the Bible is: 'It is better to trust in the Lord than to put confidence in man' (Psalm 118:8 NKJV).

So, centre your confidence on God, not yourself or anybody else.

- Do you doubt yourself and your own worth?
- Do you question your ability to pursue your career?
- Do you doubt your aptitude to form healthy relationships?

Despite having lived with Jesus for almost three years and hearing His promise that He'd rise again from the dead, Thomas still said, 'Unless I can see his wounds and touch him, I will not believe' (see John 20:25).

Did Jesus turn His back on Thomas because of his doubts?

No, He never rejects a sincere, doubting heart!

Jesus showed up in person and resolved all of Thomas' doubts.

And as you read His word and seek His face, He will alleviate your misgivings and qualms too.

When you stop living in the 'sense' realm and learn to 'walk by faith', your doubts will begin to die (see 2 Corinthians 5:7).

Thought For The Day

This is the script for a "Thought for the Day" programme on BBC Radio 4's Today Programme by Nick Baines, Bishop of Leeds since 8 June 2014:

Before the lockdowns I watched a man painting white lines in a park.

The reason I stopped was simply that I was curious to know what game the white lines were going to frame.

Before working out where to put them on the grass, you first have to know what game you want to play.

Now, this sounds obvious, I know. But, in the current climate it perhaps suggests something useful as the whole country tries to work out how to behave, which rules to follow and what guidance is most important.

Repeated mantras of "it is absolutely clear" fail to recognise that clarity is defined by the hearer and not primarily the speaker.

Hence, the first rule of communication: it's not what you say that matters, but what is heard.

I am used to this. The gospels are full of Jesus telling a story or offering an image after which he asks the audience: "Do you know what I mean? Have you got the ears to hear?"

Clearly, some couldn't hear, didn't want to hear, or refused to hear.

This is pertinent at a time when many people are clearly struggling to know how to behave best – within the Government's Covid lines of rules and guidance.

Does 'best' mean 'in a way that makes me comfortable' or 'in a way that protects me and other people'?

The point about white lines on a pitch is that everyone in the game knows where the ball can be played, can choose where to run, and is free to be creative within the parameters.

Debates in the last few weeks about compliance with government rules come down to this:

If I am to choose well, I need to understand not only where the white lines are, but also what game I think I'm playing.

Mature citizenship can be exercised where people know why they are being expected to behave in particular ways – what the game is and how to play it.



For example, if I think the most important thing in the world is my individual freedom, unconstrained by the security of other people in a common and interdependent society, I will filter out guidance that infringes that freedom to do as I like.

If, on the other hand, I take seriously that inherent interdependence, I might be ready to sacrifice my individual freedom on the altar of the common good.

To reprise the white lines theme: I might sacrifice my moment of glory by letting someone else score the goal that gives the team a victory. In my terms, this means, in the words of St Paul: "Do nothing from selfish ambition, ... but look to the interests of others".

Closing Prayers

Father of Grace, Love and forgiveness,

We pray to You for our weakness and failings;

for those times when we have failed you;

for the times we have justified a reason for looking the other way;

for the times when we have kept our hands tightly on our money avoiding the needy hand;

for the unkind words we have thought and the deaf ear we have turned.

Lord, we have already received your forgiveness, but the remembrance of our actions is still intolerable.

Lord, please make us whole again., so that we might become bearers of YOUR Good News!
