A Tale of Woe

A tale of woe': UK butterfly numbers hit by cold, wet spring. "Public urged to join world's biggest butterfly count to help collect data on impacts of climate crisis.

- If you have a bit of time to spare in the nice weather you can go into the garden or a nearby stretch of park or railway path etc., and count butterflies!
- Go with friends or take the children or grandchildren.
- Take a picnic!
- The three-week citizen science event is <u>open to everyone</u> in the UK.

A lot of our wider countryside species of butterflies are declining, and we really don't understand why. There'll be a cocktail of drivers, so it could be habitat loss, agricultural intensification, climate change as well as development.

- Butterflies are suffering serious declines in numbers at present and the
 2021 Big Butterfly Count will run from the 16th July to the 8th August.
- A three-week citizen science event is open to everyone living anywhere near an open space or countryside and takes place from 16th July to 8th August.

Participants need to spend just 15 minutes in an outdoor space counting common butterflies and day-flying moths they see and recording their findings on the Big Butterfly Count app.

Free identification sheets or an ID app are available.


This year's Big Butterfly Count, sponsored by Vivara and the DFN Foundation, is being launched at Winchester Science Centre, which neighbours Butterfly Conservation's Magdalen Hill Down nature reserve, and runs nationwide from July 16th to August 8th.
