What's in a name?

Names are important, but often, but not always, interchangeable.

In Shakespeare's "Romeo and Juliet" for example, we had the Montagues and the Capulets. Powerful families with powerful proud names.

Their names were important!

But Juliet asks, "What's in a name?" and then goes on to say, "A rose by any other name is still a rose and would smell just as sweet!".

So, names are interchangeable.

Another example can be found in international folk tunes.

A song in one country may have another name in another country, but it's still the same song.

However, in music too, for example, there are lots of "Bachs", many of them related, but there is only one that you would call THE "Bach" and countless people are passionate about J S Bach's music.

There are lots of J S Bach orchestras, choirs, societies.

One of them, The Netherland's Bach Society has just celebrated its 100 years of playing his music.

They boast the slogan, "There always is and always will be time for Bach!".

Yet, even though, not everyone is batty about Bach, and instead of "Bach" you could swap the name for Harry Kane, or Marcus Rushford, or Roger Federer, Christiano Ronaldo, Ed Sheeran, and so on.

But that slogan statement has great enthusiasm. Fans are all enthusiastic in their devotion to their particular idol. But their idols are just that! They are just idols. They have feet of clay.
